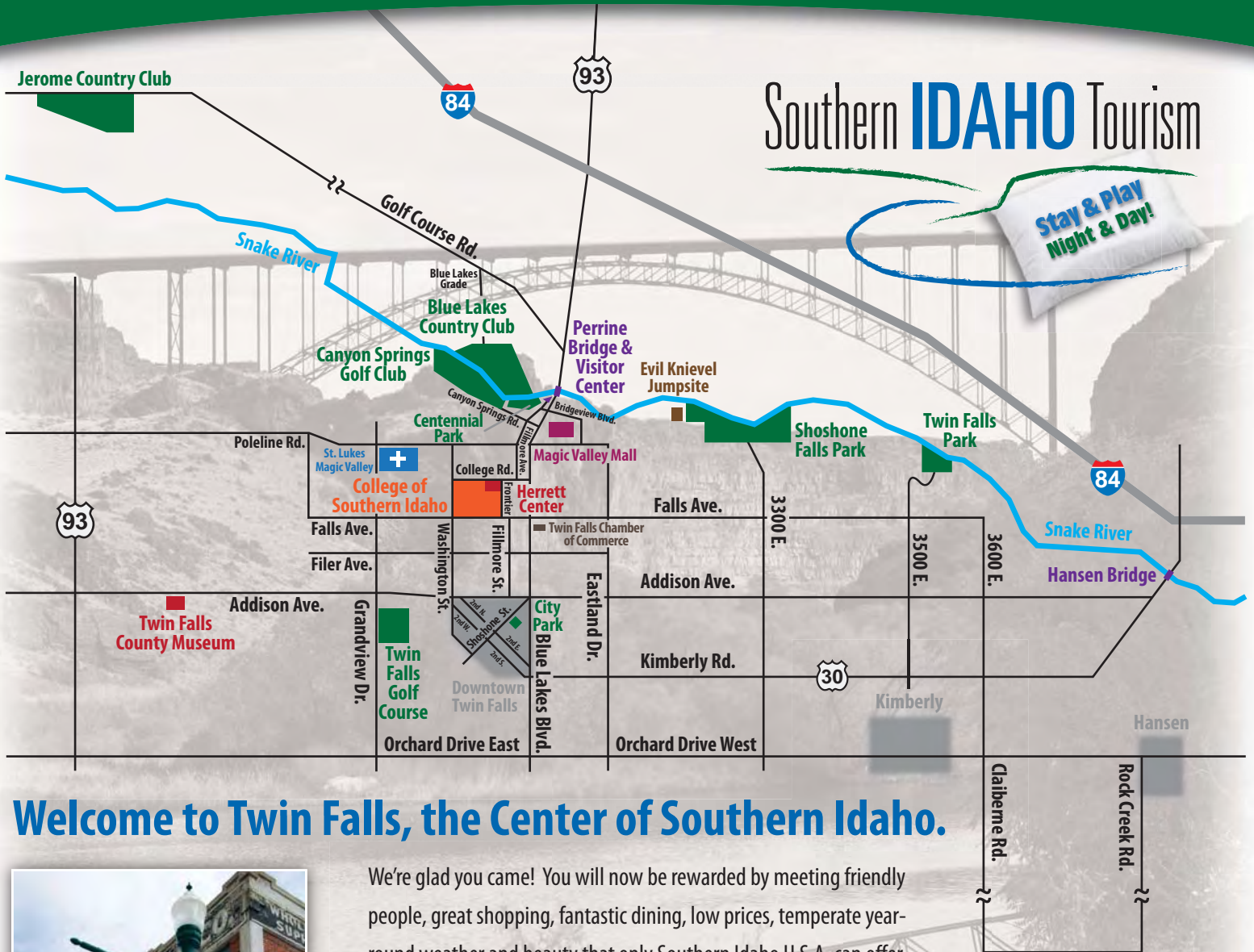

Shoshone Falls

Known as the “Niagara of the west” Shoshone Falls tumbles 212 feet to the canyon floor, that’s 50 feet higher than Niagara Falls! A must see for visitors and locals alike. Water flows are strictly dependent on snow melt. Plus, the adjacent Dierkes Lake Park is newly improved with canoes, kayaks and more! (Open dawn ‘til dusk year-round).

Perrine Bridge

Right on HWY 93, the Perrine Bridge is 1,500 feet long and 486 feet above the spectacular Snake River canyon. It’s the only place in the U.S.A. where BASE jumping is allowed without a permit. Come and enjoy the beauty or stay and watch the action – you’re going to love it!



Herrett Center Planetarium

Opened in November 1995, the Faulkner Planetarium is the largest planetarium theater in Idaho. Visitors will enjoy projection technology which immerses the audience in sights and sounds for a truly memorable experience. Located next to the Herrett Center Museum and modern observatory featuring a 24” computer controlled reflector telescope! (208) 732-6655.

Canyon Rim Trails

Easy trails, nature viewing, churning waters, and new pathways await walkers and hikers who trek the Twin Falls Canyon rim trails. Rock Creek Trail, Mogensen Trail and Auger Falls. Best hiked from spring to fall. Make sure and bring your camera.



Rock Creek Station & Stricker Homesite

Established in 1875 the Stricker Homesite is the first structure built in Twin Falls County on the Oregon Trail. The original Rock Creek Store and historical artifacts dating back to the Oregon Trail days remain intact today. And the Stricker home is still allowing visitors today (check on-site schedule).
